Meeting Minutes for February 1st 2010

Al Steel called the meeting to order. Approximately 30 members were present for this meeting. No new prospective members were present, but our latest new member, Jim Reinbold, was in attendance.

Cappy gave an updated treasurer report. We have \$21,007 in checking and savings, \$11,300 in Accounts Receivable, and \$375 in undeposited funds.

It was noted that the past Poker Run included 15 participants who returned from past events, and 13 first-time participants.

Regarding Old Business, Al Steel reminded everyone that unpaid dues are now past due. He also mentioned that the Commodores' Ball at Sorrento's was a success with about 20 people attending.

For New Business, it was noted that there are updated rules for using the Lucerne property. Cabin fees are due by April 15th. Boat slip fees are due by June 1st. Also noted was the need to sign in at the Beer Garden when using cabins, and that a minimum of eight uses of a cabin per year is necessary to keep your membership in good standing. Al noted that work party jobs will be posted in the clubhouse and that we need to get an early start on these work parties.

The club is looking for a chairperson for entertainment for this summer. Please send in your suggestions to any board member. There was a suggestion to organize a Lake Roosevelt trip this year, and to work with the Lake Chelan Yacht Club on a common project.

There was a request for member identification cards and for continuing the club newsletter. Al will follow up with the club cards, and Fred will work towards getting a newsletter restarted.

A new radio and antenna were ordered for Lucerne. Calls can be sent out but not received. We will be able to communicate with Lady of the Lake and send out emergency calls. There is also an effort to get the Forest Service integrated into the radio system. The cost to the club is estimated to be \$35 per month.

Pete Peterson will chair the Lucerne Committee, and Sam Bryant, John Pitts and Rich Whaley will perform grounds keeping duties. The meeting was adjourned at 7:55 pm.

After thirty years of operation, the radio telephone at Lucerne is about to be replaced. The system was in need of upgrading to stay current with FCC regulations. Steve Byquist has ordered the radio as well as a new antenna. If all his testing goes well, Steve will bring the radio in to the next club meeting for a little show and tell.
